June 2013 Crop Acreage

- **Corn**
 - Alabama - Planted for all purposes down 3% from 2012. Harvested for grain down 5%.
 - Florida - Planted for all purposes up 27% from 2012. Harvested for grain up 50%.
 - Georgia - Planted for all purposes up 45% from 2012. Harvested for grain up 45%.
 - South Carolina - Planted for all purposes up 5% from 2012. Harvested for grain up 5%.
- **Cotton**
 - Alabama - Plantings down 13% from last year.
 - Florida - Plantings up 16% from last year.
 - Georgia - Plantings up 1% from last year.
 - South Carolina - Plantings down 6% from last year.
- **Peanuts**
 - Alabama - Plantings down 41% from 2012. Harvested down 42%.
 - Florida - Plantings down 29% from 2012. Harvested down 30%.
 - Georgia - Plantings down 31% from 2012. Harvested down 32%.
 - South Carolina - Plantings down 23% from 2012. Harvested down 25%.
- **Soybean**
 - Alabama - Plantings up 24% from last year. Harvested up 22%.
 - Florida - Plantings up 19% from last year. Harvested up 15%.
 - Georgia - Plantings up 18% from last year. Harvested up 16%.
 - South Carolina - Plantings up 5% from last year. Harvested up 5%.
- **Winter Wheat**
 - Alabama - Plantings up 32% from last year. Harvested up 32%.
 - Florida - Plantings up 25% from last year. Harvested up 13%.
 - Georgia - Plantings up 38% from last year. Harvested up 52%.
 - South Carolina - Plantings up 11% from last year. Harvested up 11%.
