


DO YOU AI? DO YOU ChatGPT?

Based on a series of traditional sciences (algebra and statistics) and modern computational techniques enabled by large and fast computers (machine learning, optimization methods, neural networks, and deep learning), artificial intelligence (AI) has been used for a while in modeling, predicting vields, and handling large datasets. With the recent public release of ChatGPT (https://chat.openai.com/chat), Al has many potential applications in Extension. It can be used to provide personalized and on-demand assistance to clients, deliver virtual and interactive educational experiences. and assist Extension professionals in their daily tasks. ChatGPT can help to overcome geographical and time constraints by providing access to information and resources anytime and anywhere. ChatGPT can also

enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of Extension programs by automating routine tasks, reducing response time, and increasing client engagement. ChatGPT's natural language processing capabilities can improve communication and understanding between Extension professionals and their clients, and ultimately lead to better outcomes for individuals, communities, and businesses. This presentation aims at (1) demonstrating how to open a ChatGP account, (2) learning the basic possibilities and limits of ChatGPT, and (3) starting a discussion within Florida Extension about the opportunities and challenges of ChatGPT.
