



We are very excited to announce the premier of a radio program about family life that has been developed by the Department of Family, Youth and Community Sciences faculty. *Family Album* is a new twominute radio program about today's families that debuted in the North Florida area in October 2004, through WUFT-FM, the University of Florida's public radio affiliate. The program also has a companion web site at familyalbumradio.org. This program will soon be available via satellite to any radio station in the state. We are looking for ways to reach families throughout Florida and would like to work with county faculty to get Family Album Radio on the air in their local communities.

Family Album radio programs are based on up-to-date, unbiased research about the issues that Family and Consumer Sciences county faculty deal with every day--child and family development, family communication, nutritional and health concerns across the life cycle, and family financial matters throughout life. A planning of FYCS faculty in major areas of FCS (Linda Bobroff, Jo Turner, Diana Converse, Suzanna Smith) has been working for the past year to develop scripts and the companion web site and take all the necessary steps to get this program on the air. The program got a major boost last year when Donna Davis, a professional writer and radio voice, joined the team.


This program focuses on the major issues families face over the course of their lives - having a baby, learning to be a "good" parent, helping teens develop their independence while maintaining family ties, refeathering the empty nest, retiring, and more! *Family Album* also covers the bumps in the road of family life - divorce, remarriage, work and family stress, and caring for older adults. The program includes questions about dealing with financial stresses and planning for the family's financial future. It covers infant and child nutrition and feeding and nutrition and health issues in later life.

In the summer of 2004, letters were sent to county extension faculty asking them if they would like more information about the program and could help us make contacts with local stations. We have not had any replies although some faculty are apparently picking us up via WJUF Nature Coast public radio. This fall a public relations course planned to contact county extension faculty to find out how we could serve their needs better and results should be available in two weeks.

We want to make sure that county faculty understands that although we have started on public radio this is only one possible outlet. We are able to broadcast on commercial radio, so if the county faculty have contacts at other stations we would also like to make that connection. The web site could serve as a useful and informative way to get out information about county based programs on family life. There is a lot of potential for the radio program and web site reaching many people!



However, there were expenditures such as the purchase of plaques at a cost of \$313.20, distribution of \$800 in scholarship funds, and funds used to attend regional and national conferences totaling \$2,770.73. Balance in checking account as of 6/1/05 is \$8,024.50; savings account balance as of 9/30/04 is \$2,129.56; certificates of deposits – maturity date 10/6/04, automatically renewed for 28 months is \$5,480.97; and, maturity date 6/6/05 can be redeem by 6/13/05 is \$2,723.01. A detailed budget report is attached. A list of 2005 ESP members were distributed. Mary Beth Salisbury moved to accept the treasurer's report as presented, seconded by Lisa Leslie. Motion passed unanimously.

District Directors' reports received from the Northwest, Northeast, Central, and South Central Districts. There is no representative for retirees. Joe will ask Mike McKinney to represent this group.

#### Committee Reports




