
REBECCA L. JORDI 1954-2020


CHARLES "CHUCK" R. SMITH 1928-2021

WILLIAM "BILL" LLOYD BROWN JR. 1946-2021


- Served in the United State Coast Guard, awarded the Helicopter Rescue Award.
